A LOCAL LAW

In relation to a street name, Brooklyn Conservatory Way, Borough of Brooklyn.

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. The following street name is hereby designated as hereafter indicated.

New name	Present name	Limits
Brooklyn Conservatory Way	7th Avenue	between Lincoln Place and Berkeley Place

§ 2. This local law shall take effect immediately.
